Nature of the Position:

The Dean of Learning & Student Success reports directly to the Vice President of Learning & Student Success of the Northern Marianas College (NMC). This position plans, organizes, maintains, directs, and evaluates all the directors for Student Services and Academic Programs of the college.

This position oversees the Student Leadership Coordinator, Enrollment Services Director, Financial Aid

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Director, Learning Support Services Director, Library Programs & Services Director, School of Education Director, Nursing Department Chair, Social Sciences & Fine Arts Department Chair, Liberal Arts Coordinator, Natural Resource Management Coordinator, Prior Learning Assessment Coordinator, School of Business Director, Languages & Humanities Department Chair, Sciences, Math, Health & Athletics (SMHA) Department Chair, Criminal Justice Coordinator, Distance Learning Education Coordinator, and the Adult Basic Education Director.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Participates in Program Review and Outcomes Assessment (PROA) activities;
- Provides leadership and guidance to ensure proper implementation of all PROA activities;
- Monitors department work plans to ensure they are consistent with the NMC Strategic Master Plan;
- Leads department faculty and staff in curriculum evaluation, improvement, and development (establishes priorities: develops multi-year instructional plans; and participates in strategic and long-range academic planning for the college);
- Confers with unit department chairs and solicits ideas for programs and services improvement;
- Work closely with the Vice-President of Learning & Student Success to ensure the development, implementation, and continuous improvement of an academic master plan for the division;
- Ensures that academic programs and student services are evaluated and that needs assessments are conducted regularly;
- Keeps abreast of new development and innovations in community colleges and higher education;
- Recommends improvement to maintain relevance of programs to meet student and community needs;
- Participates in the development of the college budget and manages the unit's financial resources consistent with college policy and sound financial principles;
- Works cooperatively with other college administrators and supervisors to coordinate programs and services to meet student needs;

Master's degree from a U.S. Department of Education recognized accredited institution in a higher education or comparable field plus two (2) years' experience in academic administration, supervision, program and curriculum development, planning, and budgeting, and assessment in higher education and one (1) year of post-secondary teaching experience with excellent interpersonal communication and human relations skills.
