Registration Procedures**

***General Registration Procedures***

1. **Take English & Math Placement Tests.** *All students are required to take both an English & a Math placement test prior to registering. Math placement results will be reported directly to your advisor.*
2. **Obtain English placement slip in Building M, Room 1 (Classroom) or Room 01 (Office).**
3. **Fill out registration form with your academic advisor.** *Obtain required signature(s) of the instructor or of the department chair whose department teaches the course. These signatures are required for all English (EN) courses, Language courses, 200-level Physical Education (PE) courses, Further Study (FS) courses, SO 297, MA 151, MA 162, MA 192, and MA 203. Your academic advisor will tell you where to go to get your registration form entered.*
4. **Proceed to Building D, Room 1 to complete the registration process and to get your class schedule.**

**Failure to pay your tuition and fees or to sign up for a payment plan will result in your registration form being voided and course information being deleted from the system without further notice.**

***Early Registration Procedures (For SOE Seniors and Graduation Candidates ONLY)***

1. **Get English placement slip from the Languages Department in Building M, Room 1 (Classroom) or Room 01 (Office).**
2. **Fill out registration form with your academic advisor.** *Obtain required signature(s) of the instructor or the department chair whose department teaches the course. These signatures are required for all English (EN) courses, Language courses, 200-level Physical Education (PE) courses, Further Study (FS) courses, SO 297, MA 151, MA 162, MA 192, and MA 203. Your academic advisor will tell you where to get your registration form entered.*
3. **Proceed to the Office of Admissions & Records (OAR) in Building N, Room 3 for registration validation.**
4. **Go to the Financial Aid Office (if applicable) in Building N, Room 2.**
5. **Go to the Finance Office in Building N, Room 4 to finalize the registration process.**

**Failure to pay your tuition and fees or to sign up for a payment plan will result in your registration form being voided and course information being deleted from the system without further notice.**

## COURSE LOAD INSTRUCTIONS

Students can register for up to 18 credits with the academic advisor's approval. Students can register for 19-22 credits with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 and submission of a completed **Request for Course Overload** form which must be approved by both the student's academic advisor and by the department chair for the student's program.

## ENTRY TO CLOSED CLASSES

Entry to closed classes are allowed only during Add/Drop week. Beginning on the first day of Add/Drop week, please check your advisor or department administrative manager to obtain an "Entry to Closed Class" form. The Office of Admissions & Records will not allow additional entries to a class that is closed without the approved "Entry to Closed Class" form attached to the registration or add/drop form.

## ADD, DROP, & WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

To receive 100% refund of tuition and lab fees you must add/drop courses during the first week of instruction (Add/Drop Period: August 22 - 26, 2011, 8:00am – 5:00 pm)

1. Obtain an **Add/Drop Form or a Withdrawal Form** from your advisor. (*Note: On all Withdrawal from courses after the second week, a "W" will appear on your academic record.*) Please refer to page 2 for deadlines.
2. Have your **advisor initial** in the appropriate box.
3. Obtain the **instructor's signature** for the specific courses as required.
4. Proceed to the Office of Admissions and Records (Building N, Room 3) for processing and to receive a copy of your **new class schedule**.
5. Review your class schedule.
6. Proceed to the Financial Aid Office (Building N, Room 2) for **financial aid award adjustment**, if applicable.
7. Proceed to the NMC Finance Office (Building N, Room 4) for **payment**.

## COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

1. Obtain a **Complete Withdrawal Form** from your advisor.
2. Proceed to the Counseling Programs and Services Office (Building I) for an **informational interview**.
3. Proceed to the Office of Admissions and Records (Building N, Room 3) to have your Complete Withdrawal Form processed.
4. Proceed to the Financial Aid Office (Building N, Room 2) for **financial aid award adjustment**, if applicable.
5. Proceed to the NMC Finance Office (Building N, Room 4) for **financial adjustment** and final processing.

# NMC's Accreditation

## *Frequently-Asked Questions*

Updated August 2, 2011

**As announced earlier, at its June 2011 meeting, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges removed NMC from Show Cause status and placed NMC on the less-severe probation status. The Commission will again be meeting in January 2012 to consider NMC's accreditation status. The following lists responses to students' questions about NMC's accreditation.**

*What is accreditation?*

Accreditation is a status given to an educational institution that has been found to meet or exceed certain standards of educational quality. The agency that accredits NMC is the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC), which is part of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

*Why does accreditation matter?*

Accreditation matters because it helps to 1) assure the quality of the programs and services that NMC offers, and 2) it fosters and encourages institutional advancement. It also qualifies NMC for certain kinds of federal funds (for example, grants and financial aid).

*Is NMC still accredited?*

Yes. The recent decision by the accrediting commission to place NMC on Probation does not change NMC's accreditation status. NMC is still an accredited institution. The College remains committed to offering a high-quality education and excellent student services.

*What does Probation mean?*

Probation is issued when ACCJC finds that an institution deviates significantly from the ACCJC's eligibility requirements, standards, or policies, or fails to respond to actions and conditions imposed by ACCJC.

*Why is NMC on Probation?*

According to ACCJC, NMC is not in compliance with ACCJC Eligibility Requirements (ERs) and Standards in three general areas: Institutional Autonomy from Outside Interference, Institutional Financial Management and Integrity, and Institutional Governance. ACCJC also notes that NMC must address two concerns regarding its relationship with ACCJC and programs on Rota and Tinian.

*What is NMC doing to overcome Probation?*

Students, staff, faculty and the members of the Board of Regents are working collaboratively to have NMC's accreditation reaffirmed. In the meantime, those who wish to view updates of NMC's accreditation efforts can log on to [www.nmcnet.edu](http://www.nmcnet.edu).

*What will happen next?*

NMC will submit a Follow-Up report to ACCJC on October 15, 2011 which will be followed by a visit of ACCJC representatives. ACCJC will issue its decision about NMC's accreditation by early February 2012.

*What happens to my financial aid?*

Nothing. NMC's accredited status continues and students' financial aid will not be affected.

*Who can help me better understand how accreditation will impact my enrollment and plans for earning a degree?*

Counselors, academic advisors, and other staff from Student Services can help you better understand how accreditation affects your plans for earning a degree. NMC is committed to helping you achieve your educational goals. Your academic advisor or a counselor is available to assist you with the process of identifying and evaluating your options for continued enrollment and obtaining a degree.

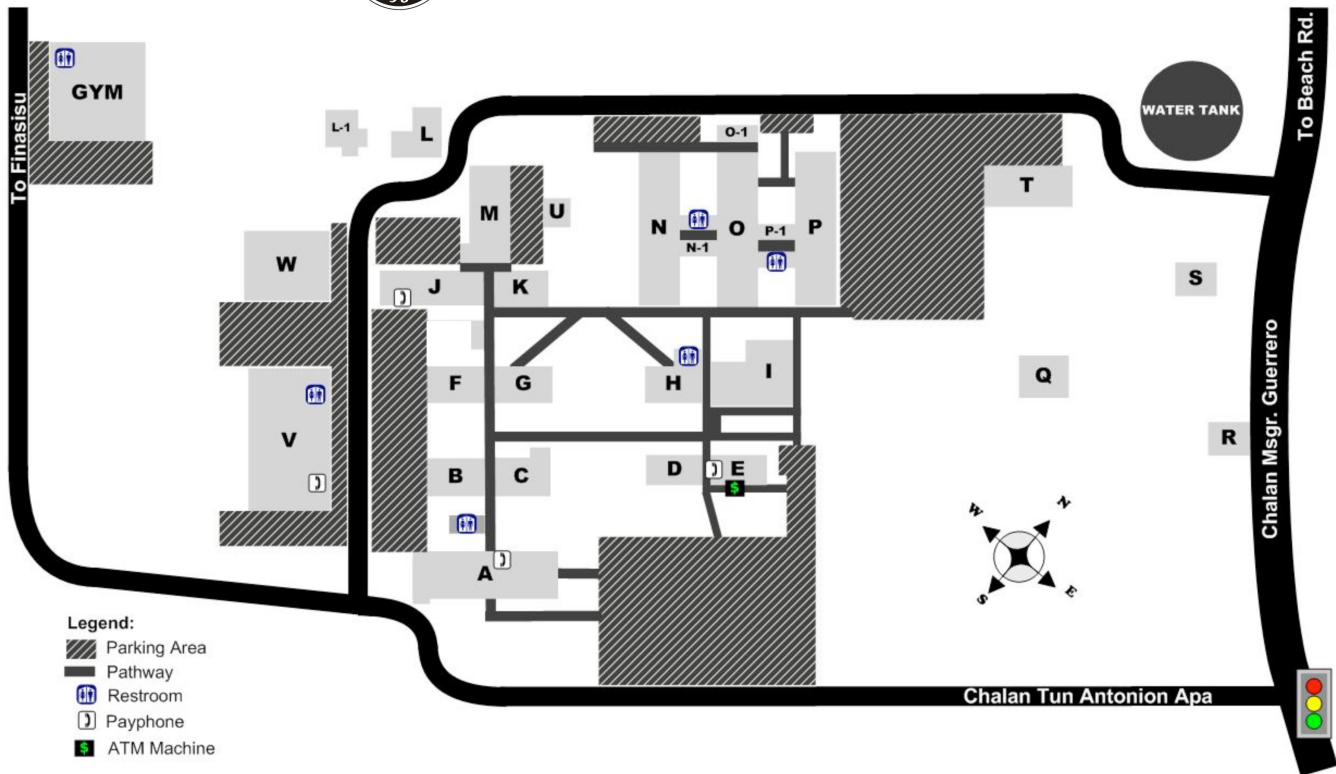
