DISCUSSION AND OUTLOOK

AT 500 AM CHST...1900 UTC...THE CENTER OF TYPHOON MAWAR WAS LOCATED NEAR LATITUDE 8.5 DEGREES NORTH AND LONGITUDE 148.1 DEGREES EAST. MAWAR IS MOVING NORTH-NORTHWEST AT 8 MPH. IT IS EXPECTED TO MAINTAIN THIS GENERAL COURSE AND SPEED THROUGH OVER THE NEXT 24 HOURS.

MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS REMAIN AT 80 MPH. MAWAR IS FORECAST TO INTENSIFY THROUGH TONIGHT.

TYPHOON FORCE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD FROM THE CENTER UP TO 40 MILES. TROPICAL STORM FORCE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD FROM THE CENTER UP TO 85 MILES.

BECAUSE OF THE ANTICIPATED THREAT OF **TYPHOON MAWAR**, **GOVERNOR ARNOLD I. PALACIOS** HAS ISSUED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS AS OF 5:00 AM.

• TYPHOON CONDITION III: SAIPAN, TINIAN, ROTA

*TYPHOON CONDITION III: MEANS THAT DAMAGING WINDS OF 39 MPH OR MORE ARE POSSIBLE MONDAY, AND TYPHOON FORCE WINDS OF 74 MPH OR GREATER ARE POSSIBLE MONDAY NIGHT THROUGH WEDNESDAY.

THE CNMI EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER STATE WARNING POINT WILL BE MONITORING THE MOVEMENT OF **TYPHOON** "MAWAR" AND WILL BE ISSUING OUT BULLETINS AS THEY BECOME AVAILABLE.
